QUICK TAKE – COMMENT PERIOD FOR LDEQ'S VOLUNTARY COMPIANCE AUDIT PROGRAM STUDY CLOSES OCTOBER 21ST

The Louisiana Department of Environmental Quality (LDEQ) is currently accepting written comments on its study of the establishment of a voluntary compliance audit program for regulated industries. LDEQ will continue to accept written comments until the close of business (4:30 p.m. CT) on Monday, October 21, 2019.

LDEQ initiated this study in response to House Resolution 231. HR231, which was passed on June 5, 2019, urges LDEQ to study the establishment of a voluntary compliance audit program and to provide a written report of the study to the House Committee on Natural Resources and Environment by no later than February 1, 2020. According to HR231, the written report is to contain: a discussion of the elements of a proposed audit program; recommendations for necessary legislation; a discussion of whether such a program is needed; and other information developed through the study that might provide further insights.

LDEQ responded to HR231 by conducting a series of informational sessions for the public and issuing a public notice of its intent to accept written comments in connection with the study. The informational sessions included a discussion of the following topics: current federal and State voluntary audit and disclosure programs and policies; the concepts of privilege and confidentiality; the concept of immunity; and State resources that would be necessary to implement a voluntary compliance audit program.
