Home: Please remember that this is my home, not just a day care. Remind your children to play in designated areas, and not with the rocks, yard lights, yard decorations, etc. If we're already outside, you're welcome to stay and play outside with us if you come early, but please re-enforce our rules. The children are not allowed to play on the far side of the yard, except for the path, but only if we are with them. They also are not allowed past the bridge, since we can't see them.



Neighbor's homes: Please remember that we are in a residential neighborhood and very fortunate that Fairfax County allows a day care here. They can take our privilege away if we are disruptive to the community. Please drive slowly in the neighborhood and walk in quietly in the morning so we do not wake up the neighbors. Fairfax requires that we park on the street in the morning and that we leave our gate open so they don't hear car and gate doors opening and closing while they're still trying to sleep.

Labeling: Please be sure to label everything. I highly recommend using Name Bubbles. They are pricey, but they have stuck to sippy cups that are run through the dish washer daily for over two years! I just put "Lukas" on my girls' labels so I didn't have to buy two sets.

Forms: I still need a few forms updated by a few people. I will place the notebook on the washing machine and review them with you. If you haven't given me updated immunization records in the last 6 months, please request a copy from your doctor.

Vacation: I (and my assistants) get three paid days off. While I do my best to let you know of any scheduled days in advance, there are times that it just isn't possible.

Communication: I do my best to update you on anything new going on with your child. If you notice anything new or are trying out something new, like potty training, new foods, new classes, please share that with me too. The kids like to talk about it and some things are very helpful to be on the same page with. Also let me know if they had a rough night or morning...or if mom or dad has been away or working late so we can give them a little extra attention. If you ever need more information from me, please let me know and I'm happy to talk longer at the end of the day or email or schedule a phone call.

Early drop-offs and late pick-ups: Please do not drop off early, unless we have made a special arrangement ahead of time. Please try to be on time. I know this is difficult with busy jobs and NOVA traffic. We all know NOVA traffic can be crazy...and getting stuck behind a bus takes a long time, so please factor that into your schedule. If you think you'll be late, please call/text me asap so I can plan accordingly. I charge a substantial late fee for late pick-ups. Thanks!

Fun Activities

Field Trips: Sometimes we take walking field trips around the neighborhood. We try to always be back by 4:00. If you think you'll be here before then, please give us a heads up so your child is ready when you are.







Hummingbird: We have enjoyed catching glimpses of our humming birds! They come regularly to the feeder by the fenced in flower garden by the day care door. Feel free to sit still on the white chairs and one will usually appear within five minutes.

Al's Pals: The kids love Al's Pals. We will continue this confidence-building program with our 3 and 4 year olds again this year.



Independence:

Let your children do as much as they can on their own. The pride and joy that they have in putting on their own coat, shoes, or other items is enormous. It builds confidence and, although it may take your time upfront, it saves you time later
