B. Small Quilts: (length plus width equals less than 120 inches)

1800-Appliquéd, Machine Quilted 1900-Mixed Techniques, Machine Quilted 2000-Other Techniques, Machine Quilted

C. Quilts-No Size Limitations (except for the 110" width rule stated above and the 24" rule for category 2300, miniatures)

2100-First Quilt, Hand or Machine Quilted 2200-Youth, any technique listed above, made by anyone 15 yrs of age or younger. No element of the quilt top should be made by an adult. 2300- Miniature: Every element is appropriately reduced in scale;

overall quilt size is no larger than 24" x 24". Hand or Machine Quilted 2400- Exhibit Only, Quilts to be displayed but not judged, as space allows.

Understanding Categories

Mixed Techniques - A quilt containing a significant amount of 2 or more techniques used to develop the design of the top.

Other Techniques - Example: Art quilts, whole cloth, photo transfer, Cathedral Window, Yo-Yo and Crazy Quilts of the appropriate size will be considered in this category.

Machine quilted not guided by computer would be by the use of any machine, desktop or track, short, mid, or long arm, as the quilter 'hand guides' the sandwich or the machine to complete the quilt design.

Machine quilted guided by computer would be accomplished by a computer attached to the machine for the purpose of guiding the machine as it quilts the design.

The Quilt Show Committee and Judge have the final decision on quilt category and have the right to place a quilt in the most applicable category, or to consolidate categories if there are insufficient entries.

QUILT SHOW DEADLINES AND INFORMATION – PLEASE READ CAREFULLY

Entry forms:

All entry materials must be received no later than August 10, 2019 regardless of the method of delivery. Plan for the extra time needed if you decide to mail the required materials.

• Any participant may only enter up to five (5) items.

No double knit quilts will qualify for entry. Quilts that were awarded First Place in previous years' shows can be considered appropriate for Category 2400- For display only, not to be judged, and only as space allows.

Quilts hand-delivered:

Quilts must be delivered in a disposable plastic bag (NO PILLOWCASES) to the Summers A. Norman Center at 526 E. Commerce St., Jacksonville, TX on Wednesday, September 11th from noon until 4pm. Quilts will be secured behind locked doors until judging and hanging on Thursday.

Quilts mailed or shipped:

- <u>Mailed or shipped entries</u> must be sent so that they <u>arrive no later than September 7, 2019</u>. We cannot be held responsible for delays in delivery.
- <u>Mailed or shipped entries</u> should be sent in a sturdy box, which will be used to return the quilt. A PREPAID MAILING LABEL OR A CHECK MADE OUT TO Heart & Home Quilt Shop FOR THE EXACT AMOUNT NEEDED FOR RETURN SHIPPING MUST BE INCLUDED. - IF YOU WANT CONFIRMATION YOUR QUILT WAS RECEIVED, PLEASE REQUEST A DELIVERY CONFIRMATION FORM FROM YOUR SHIPPER.
- Each entrant will receive a receipt or 'claim check' for each quilt entered. This receipt MUST be presented to reclaim your quilt. No entry will be released without a receipt. All entries must remain on display for the entire show. No entry will be released prior to 6 PM on Saturday September 14, 2019. If your agent is picking up your entry, the agent must have the receipt.

QUILT PREPARATION

- All entries <u>must be clean, in good condition, and free from smoke odor and pet hair.</u>
- A label must be attached on the lower back side of the quilt, stating the title of the quilt and quilt maker(s).
- All quilts must have a hanging sleeve. Please do not send any rods or hanging devices of your own.

HOW TO MAKE A SLEEVE

(1) Cut a fabric 8.5 inches wide by the width of the quilt. (2) Put a one half inch hem in each short end. (3) Fold the piece lengthwise wrong side out and (4) sew the long raw edges together with a quarter inch seam. (5) Turn right side out and press with the seam near the bottom. If quilt length is greater than 90 inches the sleeve top shall be placed 90 inches from the bottom edge of the quilt. (6) Sew the top and the bottom of the sleeve to the back of the quilt. Attaching the sleeve is generally by hand basting so that no stitches are seen on the front; however, that is left to the owner's determination.

AWARDS:

The judge will determine 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place entries in each category except 2400. Exhibitors will receive a written critique sheet on each judged entry.
