DOCKETING ORDER FOR THE MONTHS OF MARCH AND APRIL 2021

Pursuant to Orders of the Tennessee Supreme Court concerning mitigating the risks associated with COVID-19 in public forums, the criminal General Sessions Court of Campbell County, Tennessee, hereby ORDERS as follows:

CASES WHICH CAN BE RESCHEDULED

1. If you are the defendant on a case and the only charges you have are for misdemeanor traffic violations (such as speeding, no insurance, using a cell phone while driving) *and* the case did not involve an allegation of driving under the influence, anything drug or alcohol-related, *or* a crash, then you or your lawyer (or your parent if you are a minor child) should contact the Clerk's office immediately at (423) 562-2624 for a rescheduling of your court date to a future date after the pandemic has passed, rather than appearing in court during the months of March or April 2021. If you or your lawyer fail to do either of the above PRIOR TO your Court date, and you do not pay your case in full prior to your court date, and you thereafter fail to appear (either in person or electronically) for your court date during these specified months without sufficient excuse, then this will constitute a failure to appear on your Court date.

**CASES WHICH CANNOT BE (OR HAVE NOT ALREADY BEEN)
RESCHEDULED SHALL BE ON A TIME DOCKET**

2. All other cases on the Campbell County General Sessions criminal docket which are set for the months of March or April 2021, and which involve an *incarcerated* defendant shall be set for hearing at 9:00 a.m. on the same day as the case was previously set. Otherwise, all cases on the Campbell County General Sessions criminal docket in the specified months which do *not* involve an individual who is *incarcerated at the time of the hearing* are hereby set as follows:

(a) If the Defendant's last name begins with the letter A through E and the Defendant is not incarcerated on the hearing date, then that case is now set at 9:00 a.m. on the same day as the case was previously set.

(NOTE: If the Defendant's last name is hyphenated, then the first portion of their hyphenated last name prevails.)

(b) If the Defendant's last name begins with the letter F through J, and the Defendant is not incarcerated on the hearing date, then that case is now set at 10:00 a.m. on the same day as the case was previously set.

(c) If the Defendant's last name begins with the letter K through M, and the Defendant is not incarcerated on the hearing date, then that case is now set at 11:00 a.m. on the same day as the case was previously set.


(d) If the Defendant's last name begins with the letter N through S, and the Defendant is not incarcerated on the hearing date, then that case is now set at 1:00 p.m. on the same day as the case was previously set.

(e) If the Defendant's last name begins with the letter T through W, and the Defendant is not incarcerated on the hearing date, then that case is now set at 2:00 p.m. on the same day as the case was previously set.

(f) If the Defendant's last name begins with the letter X through Z, and the Defendant is not incarcerated on the hearing date, then that case is now set at 3:00 p.m. on the same day as the case was previously set.

3. All persons appearing in Court (whether attorneys, defendants, victims, witnesses, non-parties, members of the media, or members of the public) to whom paragraph 1 does not apply shall read and abide by this Court's Order of Procedure for the specified months of March and April 2021, taking measures to appear in Court electronically rather than in-person during these months, wherever possible.
